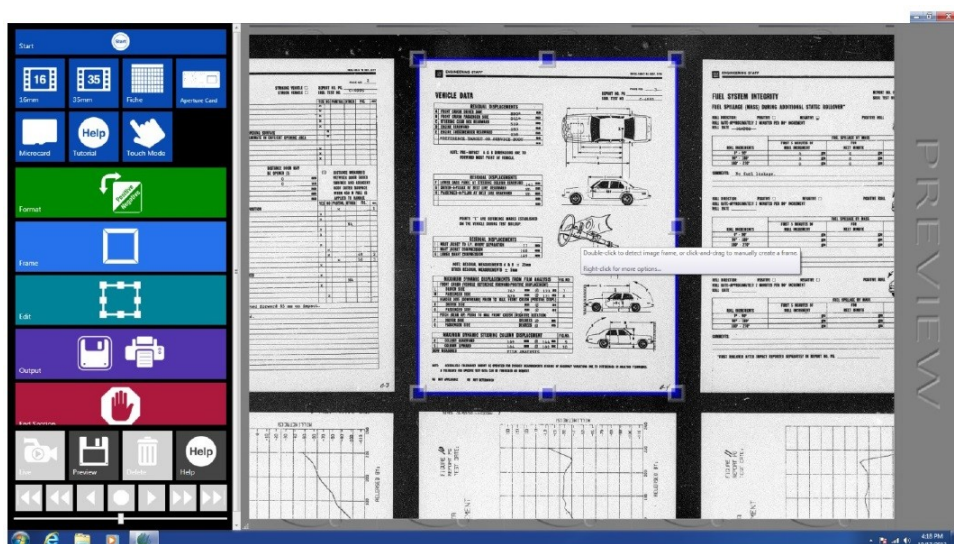

Stoneham Library receives LSTA grant



Health & Wellness

The Stoneham Public Library is honored to be awarded a 2017 LSTA Health Literacy grant from the Massachusetts Board of Library Commis-

sioners, specifically to address the issue of substance abuse. The library will receive \$7,500 to “strengthen its role as a resource for improving the health literacy” for our community. We will partner with the Stoneham schools; the Stoneham Substance Abuse Coalition; and the Stoneham Senior Center toward that end. The funds from this grant will enhance the library’s digital and print collection; support speakers and workshops; and purchase equipment. The grant year activities are implemented beginning in October 2016 and run through September 2017. The goals of this project will be most effectively met with the involvement of the entire staff.

The Health Literacy Grant affords the library a significant opportunity to offer the

Stoneham community a wide array of health information resources and programming. The Stoneham Public Library will also benefit from the ongoing partnership with numerous community groups that will enhance our visibility.
