

Stoneham, Massachusetts: Victorian Entertainment Capital & More June 22nd, 7PM


In the past everyone loved the town's famous parades featuring the Stoneham Brass Band, military units and, in particular, the "Ancients and Horribles" who spoofed politicians or the powerful. During festivals in the Odd Fellows' Hall, Professor Queen, necromancer, dazzled residents with his tricks while his troupe of clowns, animals and jugglers captivated the children. Bountiful community meals were often enhanced by selections from the Ladies Quartette. Even the labor protests of the shoe factory workers incorporated music and movement. Visual art expanded

in 1917 when the Stoneham Theatre opened, becoming the third local movie house. Join us for a fun exploration of Stoneham's fascination with entertainment!






Mountains beyond Mountains by Tracy Kidder.




There is no me without you by Melissa Fay Greene.




The King Years: historic moments in the civil rights movement by Taylor Branch.
