



Staff picks

December brings on winter and here are a few books that focus on cold climes and living under Russian rule in Ukraine and Chechnya respectively. These books are well written and depict the struggle of people in Soviet strongholds during brutal winters.



The Child Thief depicts life in Ukraine during the early years of Soviet rule. A child serial killer is at large and a man and his two sons travel through the bitter winter to catch the man responsible for these heinous acts. A wonderful mystery, and historical description of countries under Soviet rule during the 1930's.

A Constellation of Vital Phenomena is a brilliantly written novel about the Chechnyan War and how disparate people come together in the horror of war. A Russian doctor and a Chechnyan work together to save lives at an abandoned hospital.

A fine novel depicting the tragedy in war but resonating a glimmer of hope as characters rise above the ethnic bitterness to help each other.
