Children's Internet Use Policy

The Children's Room of the Stoneham Public Library serves children through age twelve. Adult use of these computers is restricted to those individuals who are assisting a child with the computer, conducting a search of children's materials, or have a child in a supervised library program. All other adults are asked to use computers in the Adult Library. Children in need of a computer will have priority over any adult in the Children's Room.

Stoneham Public Library does not limit access to electronic information. Therefore, children eight and under must be accompanied by an adult when using computers with Internet access. Parents and guardians must assume full responsibility for information selected/accessed by their children.

The Children's Room has three Internet access and word processing computers available for public use, all of which are connected to printers where copies can be made. Printed pages cost ten cents for black and white copies. One computer is available strictly for word processing.

Monday through Friday from 2pm-6pm, two PCs with Internet access are limited to use for homework purposes only. All computers have a sixty minute limit so that fair and equitable time is provided.
